Officer Mata was pleased to report that the crime stats are showing a trend in the right direction. This time last year the crime rates were off the charts, and violent crimes in the Hollywood Entertainment District (HED) were especially concerning. Today they are showing a 46% decrease overall in comparison with this time last year. Hollywood Captains are also looking to increase the number of officers in the HED by this summer.

Earlier this month LAPD arrested a man who had a cache of weapons in an 18th floor apartment with panoramic views which include a busy street and public park. Neighbors had reported to the police he had made bizarre threats and alarming comments to residents and security staff at the apartment building.

III. Recap / Review of 2022

HDCA Membership was up last year slightly over the prior year at 178 member households.

- 90% paid \$50 or more
- 10% paid the senior / student reduced rate of \$25
- Total income from dues donations = \$10,015

Financial Recap

Total Income for 2022 = \$15,015

- \$10,015 from dues
- \$5,000 foundation grant*

*Note: The foundation grant arrived at the end of 2022 and will be applied to a special project this year

2022 Total Expenses = \$8,304

Breakdown Of Expenses:

- 44% Events Summer Block Party, Holly-ween in the Dell, Neighborhood Cleanup Day etc.
- 29% Donations To Other Organizations Cheremoya School, National Wildlife Foundation, National Night Out (LAPD), LA Fire Department Station 82, etc.
- 14% Neighborhood Projects Little Free Libraries, Pet Waste Stations, Welcome Baskets, Volunteer recognitions
- 13% Operating Costs P.O. Box, website, banking fees, office supplies, etc.
