Vacation Break-Ins. Empty homes are attractive targets for thieves.

As we approach the summer months when people go on vacation, it's important to secure your property. Arrange for house sitter. Use your alarm if you have one. If you have a private patrol service, ask them to do a "vacation watch." Take the time to document your valuables (take photos and make a list) as a way to assist the police in returning your valuables and to use when making insurance claims.

List of tips from Senior Lead Officer Mata if you are going to be away from your home for extended periods:

- Secure your valuables (in a safe or at another trusted location)
- Arrange to have your home visited or have someone stay there while you are away
- Notify your security company if you subscribe to one and request "vacation watch"
- Notify your trusted nearby neighbors (and your watch captain if you have one) so they can keep an eye out.
- Set lights on timers to mimic occupancy.
- Do not post on social media that you are going on vacation or out of town, or while you are away.
- Lock garage, windows and doors from the inside.
- Consider stopping mail / newspaper delivery so it doesn't pile up.
- Report suspicious activity.

#### Deployment

Deployment of officers in Hollywood is slowly getting better. Both Captains are committed to getting the Hollywood Entertainment District as close as they can back to pre-pandemic levels. There are two officers assigned to Hollywood & Highland every day for at least 10 hours per day. There is also a Violent Crime Task Force working out of Hollywood about 3-5 times a week specifically to address violent crime.

The Hollywood United Neighborhood Council (HUNC) is in a critical state right now. Elections for 17 open seats were supposed to happen in April. Only a handful of candidates applied. They didn't have enough to hold the election. Now the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (LA City entity that oversees the NC's) will be appointing people to the open seats.

The City of Los Angeles has 99 Neighborhood Councils. They are advisory boards that advocate for their communities with City Hall. They are part of the LA City Government and have annual budgets funded by taxpayer dollars. Councils are comprised of volunteers who are elected by their communities.

The Hollywood Dell falls within the borders of the Hollywood United Neighborhood Council (HUNC).

Anyone who is interested in being appointed to a volunteer board position on HUNC should reach out to Tom. The area covered is Hollywood Boulevard to the Hollywood Sign, and Cahuenga to Western. Anyone who lives, works, attends church or has interest in the area qualifies as a stakeholder. It's approximately a 20 hours / month commitment.

Currently HUNC is stalled until new board members are appointed because they don't have quorum to hold meetings.

The traffic officers posted at key intersections are hired by the Hollywood Bowl to assist with traffic flow. They are not legally able (due to state law) to prevent anyone from coming in or out of the neighborhood but they are there to assist with traffic flow and act as a visual deterrent to non-residents.

The most recent problems were a result of some new traffic officers who didn't know which locations to go to. So they just weren't at the Dell locations they were needed at. They are working to resolve this.

Someone asked if it would be possible to have a closure at Odin and Cahuenga? This may prevent people from coming through the Dell (using Holly Drive), which causes issues. This would need to be looked at. They would need to do a full traffic engineering study to see what the options are.

## III. HDCA Business & Announcements

#### **HDCA Board Action**

The HDCA has joined a coalition of LA Neighborhood groups asking for improved short-term rental enforcement by the City of LA. The grassroots group is called **Preserve LA Neighborhoods** (PLAN). At this date over 24 neighborhood associations have joined and a letter has been drafted and sent to Mayor Bass and the LA City Council. This letter is asking for the city to fund the departments that are tasked with enforcing the ordinance. Illegal short-term rentals cause a lot of problems for neighborhoods, and take much needed housing off the long-term rental market.

#### Hollywood Dell Summer Block Party & Pet Parade Update
